



Report with the Board of Representatives

The campaigns in student union body of representative of local government. Students government members asked for time to attend the local government meeting.

Students asked some questions, they received the following answers:

1. How long has self-government existed?

The first municipal elections were in the autumn of 1990 in Újtikos. The villagers could select among the leaders, a mayor and representatives.

How many members are there in the panel?

5 people

How many man are? 3 men

How many women are? 2 women



2. How often is the election?

Local elections are in every fourth year. The parliamentary elections are held previously.

3. How often do the body meet?

Generally they meet monthly. Of course there are unforeseen events that require quick and decisive decision. In such cases, call a special meeting - said the village's mayor.

4. When is the agenda decided?

At the beginning of each year, the plan is prepared. There are pre-defined tasks whose deadline is known in advance. For example: budget, operation of the institution, services, cooperation with various organizations, regular reports.

5. Who are allowed to participate in the meetings?

The meetings are open. The public may attend as an observer to it. They get to know information about the tasks and decisions were carried out by the council. If there is an issue in which a person is concerned, it will be presented at a closed meeting.

6. How do you keep in touch with the public?

The types of information:

- Personal information
- Local news
- Website
- Information about the meeting time

7. How often are the residents informed? What form in?

Monthly the agenda of the board meetings is published in the Memorandum, the most important decisions are announced in the newspaper or on the website.

8. How are decisions made? Who are involved?

After adequate preparation, the materials are presented. Members receive it in written form in advance. On the Board meeting, representatives can ask and comment on the substance. Then decision is made with vote. Based on the majority of the body, the local decisions and regulations will be made.

- The major and the clerk are responsible for the preparation and submission.

9. What are the main tasks of a representative body?

To make reasonable choice, focusing on the interests of the local inhabitants.

For example: education, medical care, hygiene, drinking water, waste management, lighting, social issues, taxes, investments in connection.

10. Who assist their work?

During the work, a lot of help come from the citizens, among others, the leaders of our institutions, by workers in the office, the Civil Kistérségtől MP, the Labour Centre and the Administrative Office.



After the report, the students could get an insight into the work of the council, then they could discover the interesting rooms of the local council.
